World surrounded by water and distinct from Asia, and in Vespucci's honor they gave this New World a name: America. The Fourth Part of the World is the story behind that map, a thrilling saga of geographical and intellectual exploration, full of outsize thinkers and voyages. Taking a kaleidoscopic approach, Toby Lester traces the origins of our modern worldview. Discovered accidentally in 1901 in the library of a German castle it was bought in 2003 for the unprecedented sum of \$10 million by the Library of Congress, where it is now on permanent public display.
