project team. The dedication of the team and the willingness of  
the patients to contribute to the project, has led to a unique  
case study approach focused on the lived experience of  
patients and care partner(s) during the transplant/cellular  
therapy journey. The case studies are unique in that they  
encompass a qualitative narrative developed using Interpretive  
Phenomenological Analysis (IPA) and the inclusion of the  
individual's actual medical and nursing care from their health  
record. At every step along the trajectory of the illness, the  
medications and care received are described, interspersed with

experiences. The chapters follow the individual patients and  
their care partner(s) through all phases of their illness. The  
interviews were conducted, and case studies written by the

The premise of nursing support for survivorship is woven throughout the book, highlighting how giving back aids in recovery identity. Family Mobility Dec 08 2021 Family mobility decisions reveal much about how the public and private realms of social life interact and change. This sociological study explores how contemporary families reconcile individual members' career and education projects within the family unit over time and space, and unpacks the intersubjective constraints on workforce mobility. This Australian mixed methods study sampled Defence Force families and middle class professional families to illustrate how families' educational projects are necessarily and deeply implicated in issues of workforce mobility and immobility, in complex ways. Defence families move frequently, often absorbing the stresses of moving through 'viscous' institutions as private troubles. In contrast, the selective mobility of middle class professional families and their 'no go zones' contribute to the public issue of poorly serviced rural communities. Families with different social, material and vocational resources at their disposal are shown to reflexively weigh the benefits and risks associated with moving differently. regions of the world. The objective is to find out to what extent  
a difference between the attributed sexes is perceived with  
regard to the selected countries. This is a quantitative research  
that has been empirically collected. In the first part, the theory  
and the state of research of the topic are explained. This is  
followed by a methodological explanation whereupon the  
results and the corresponding interpretations are presented. A  
summary of the results and an outlook into the future  
concludes the research work. It is a common perception that  
successful women are not feminine enough. But what are  
typical female characteristics? Do women always have to be  
warm-hearted, domestic or sensitive? Or on the contrary: Do  
men always have to be courageous, assertive and ambitious?  
Especially in the business sector, it is becoming increasingly  
common for women to want to pursue a successful career.  
According to an analysis by the Boston Consulting Group  
(BCG), the number of women on the executive floors is  
increasing. However, this change took time, because  
compared to 2017, 2018 a total of seven percent of the  
positions were filled by women, one percent more than in the  
previous year. Due to the fact that this area was originally  
dominated only by men, attributes such as imperious, dominant

or successful are more likely to be connected to the male gender. The fact that it is still possible for women to move up the executive floor and men giving up their jobs completely to become husbands that stay at home, makes us reconsider the ascription of attributes. While in some countries such an exchange of roles does not seem unusual, it is difficult to imagine in other countries for example in India or Saudi Arabia, as the attribution of gender seems to depend on the country. The essence of this work, which is written from the perspective of the German population, is based on the study of the phenomenon that gender orientation is generally assessed on the foundation of assumptions of a particular country.

Previous research shows that language contributes to gender inequality in various ways: Gender-related information is transmitted through formal and semantic features of language, such as the grammatical category of gender, through gender-related connotations of role names (e.g., manager, secretary), and through customs of denoting social groups with derogatory vs. neutral names. A Comparison of Elementary, Middle, and High School Teachers' Orientations Toward Motivating Students Oct 03 2021 Developmental psychologists have long known that students are less interested in school and academic tasks with each additional year in school (Eccles & Midgely, 1989). In addition, they know that the most effective predictor of

motivation at any age is self-efficacy, a student's perception of his/her academic ability in a specific domain. Factors influencing self-efficacy include: previous successful experiences, social models, the opinions of others, and one's self-perceived efficacy in relation to peers simultaneously engaged in the same tasks (Pressley & McCormick, 2007). Using a sample of 424 teachers in four rural and one urban district in Northwest Illinois, this study sought to measure differences in the motivational orientations of elementary, middle, and high school teachers. The Problems in School Questionnaire (Deci, Schwartz, Sheinman, & Ryan, 1981) was administered to teachers of grades 1-12 and collected at building meetings during November and December, 2009. The results confirmed that high school teachers prefer more controlling, and less autonomy-supportive responses to common educational scenarios than do elementary and middle school teachers. The results further confirmed a positive interactive effect between a teacher's gender, grade level teaching assignment, and his/her motivational orientation for control or autonomy-support. In grades 1-8, female teachers selected responses that were more autonomy-supportive than controlling, while male teachers selected responses that were more controlling than autonomy-supportive. However, the difference between male and female teachers' autonomy-supportive responses was not significant among high school teachers. According to "Self-Determination Theory" (Deci & Ryan, 2000), human motivation is influenced by our analysis of the likelihood that a given task will increase feelings of competence, autonomy, and relatedness. This study suggests that as students progress through school, they are less likely
