He wrote about 30 novels, an uncounted number of short-stories and a few essays and plays. His most successful novel, *Slaughterhouse-Five* or *The Children's Crusade, a Duty Dance with Death*, was his sixth book and published in 1969. This research paper will focus on the connection between Billy Pilgrim, the main character of *Slaughterhouse-Five*, and the life of Kurt Vonnegut. Furthermore, it will make use of this connection in order to suggest why Kurt Vonnegut wrote this book. Pilgrim, who is an American World War II veteran and survived the allied air raid on Dresden in early 1945, strikes the reader as a very eccentric person. Shadows of Slaughterhouse Five chronicles the story of 150 American POWs captured in the Battle of the Bulge and eventually caught up in one of the greatest tragedies of World War II---the firebombing of Dresden.
