His explanation of social phenomena was based on the principle of "consciousness of kind" -- his theory that each person has an innate sense of belonging to particular social groups. Giddings encouraged statistical studies in sociology. His most important works are *The Principles of Sociology* (1896), *Studies in the Theory of Human Society* (1922), and *The Scientific Study of Human Society* (1924).
