Ashlynn Blake, minor goddess of the hunt—lethal, beautiful, and able to connect with animals on a psychic level—is the perfect person to place judgment upon an accused dragon. But first she has to prove to the gods that Ty Sullivan is innocent of his crimes. If she fails, she's doomed to lose her heart along with him forever. Ty's been beaten, scarred, and betrayed by females. He doesn't trust them, can't stand being around them for longer than he or his dragon needs to be. Yet, when he meets Ashlynn, his dragon is ready to mate, but the man believes she's no different than the others. The Fates have thrown them together, forcing secrets to be told and igniting a passion so fierce it may destroy both of them. What does it mean to be the nation's doctor?
