the bracero programs from the spanish term bracero bra'se ro meaning manual laborer or one who works using his arms were the result of a series of laws and diplomatic agreements initiated on august 4 1942 when the united states signed the mexican farm labor agreement with mexico 1 a former bracero farmworker breaks his silence recalling abuse and exploitation from 1942 to 1964 the bracero program allowed mexicans to cross the border to work on u s farms and railroads braceros history compensation the us had two bracero or guest worker programs under which mexicans were recruited to work on us farms under the terms of bilateral agreements the first between 1917 and 1921 left the mexican government dissatisfied because many braceros experienced discrimination in the us and some wound up with few braceros watsonville californiain the united statesthe bracero
