Green Hill II (1741-1826), son of Green Hill and Grace Bennett, was born in North Carolina, served in the Revolutionary war, and was a leader of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He married twice and died near Nashville, Tennessee. In 2017, Sophie Pierce's life changed forever when her twenty-year-old son Felix died suddenly and unexpectedly. Thrown into an unimaginable new reality, she had to find a way to survive.
