The candidate must also have an acceptable safety profile relative to the potential benefit of treatment. Safety concerns for oncologic agents are frequently related to the mechanism of activity, so unfortunately they often track with efficacy, but they can also be related to off-target effects, such as nonselectivity or metabolite activity. Engineering a qualified drug candidate with

the appropriate and balanced pharmacokinetic, pharmacodynamic, and safety properties rarely occurs by happenstance, although one must be able to recognize and exploit serendipitous success in this field. For small molecule drug candidates, these qualities are engineered by way of optimization and multiple structure-activity and structure-liability response iterations, involving the integrated activities of pharmaceutical medicinal chemists, pharmacokineticists and toxicologists.
